written with the clarity and insight that readers have come to expect of mike featherstone undoing culture is a notable contribution to our understanding of modernism and postmodernism it explores the formation and deformation of the cultural sphere and the effects on culture of globalization against many orthodox postmodernist accounts the author argues that it is wrong to regard our present state of fragmentation and dislocation as an epochal break existing interdependencies and power balances are not so easily broken down nonetheless some important cultural changes have occurred since world war ii in particular the book examines some of the processes which have uncoupled culture from the social the erosion of the ideal of the heroic life in the face of the onslaught from consumerism and the deformation of culture and the rise of new forms of identity development it explains why culture has gained a more significant role in everyday life and also why it has come to preoccupy the academy in recent years mike featherstone looks at the effects of the multiplication of cultural goods and images on our ability to read culture and develop fixed meanings and relationships he highlights the importance of the global in attempting to cope with the objective difficulties of cultural overproduction the book concludes that the rise of non western nation states with different cultural frames produces different reactions of modernity making it more appropriate to refer to global modernities

the sexual violence and impunity in south asia research project coordinated by zubaan and supported by the international development research centre brings together for the first time in the region a vast body of knowledge on this important yet silenced subject six country volumes one each on bangladesh nepal pakistan sri lanka and two on india as well as two standalone volumes comprising over fifty research papers and two book length studies detail the histories of sexual violence and look at the systemic institutional societal individual and community structures that work together to perpetuate impunity for perpetrators in this remarkable and wide ranging study activist and historian v geetha unpacks the meanings of impunity in relation to sexual violence in the context of south asia the state s misuse of its own laws against its citizens is only one aspect of the edifice of impunity its less understood resilience comes from its consistent denial of the recognition of suffering on the part of victims and its refusal to allow them the dignity of pain grief and loss time and again in south asia the state has worked to mediate public memory to manipulate forgetting particularly in relation to its own acts of commission it has done this by refusing to take responsibility not only for its acts but also for the pain such acts have caused it has denied suffering the eloquence the words the expression that it deserves and papered over the hurt of its people with routine government procedures the author argues that the state and its citizens must work together to accord social recognition to the suffering of victims and survivors of sexual violence and thereby join in what she calls a shared humanity while this may or may not produce legal victories the acknowledgment that the suffering of our fellow citizens is our collective responsibility is an essential first step towards securing justice it is this that in a fundamental sense challenges and illuminates the contours and details of state impunity and positions impunity as not merely a legal or political conundrum but as resolute refusal on the part of state personnel to be part of a shared humanity

a study of how south carolina's federal district courts were central to achieving and solidifying gains during the civil rights movement as the first comprehensive study of one state s federal district courts during the long civil rights movement the slow undoing argues for a reconsideration of the role of the federal courts in the civil rights movement it places the courts as a central battleground at the intersections of struggles over race law and civil rights during the long civil rights movement black and white south carolinians used the courts as a venue to contest the meanings of the constitution justice equality and citizenship african american plaintiffs and lawyers from south carolina with the support of thurgood marshall and other lawyers from the naacp legal defense and education fund brought and argued civil rights lawsuits in south carolina's federal courts attempting to secure the vote raise teacher salaries and to equalize and then desegregate schools parks and public life in response white citizens state politicians and local officials hired their own lawyers who countered these arguments by crafting new legal theories in an attempt to defend state practices and thwart african american aspirations of equality and to preserve white supremacy the slow undoing argues for a reconsideration of the role of federal courts in the civil rights movement by demonstrating that both before and after brown v board of education the federal district courts were centrally important to achieving and solidifying civil rights gains it relies on the entire legal record of actions in the federal district courts of south carolina from 1940 to 1970 to make the case it argues that rather than relying on litigation during the pre brown era and direct action in the post brown era african americans instead used courts and direct action in tandem to bring down legal segregation throughout the long civil rights era but the process was far from linear and the courts were not always a progressive force the battles were long the victories won were often imperfect and many of the fights remain author stephen h lowe offers a chronicle of this enduring struggle
